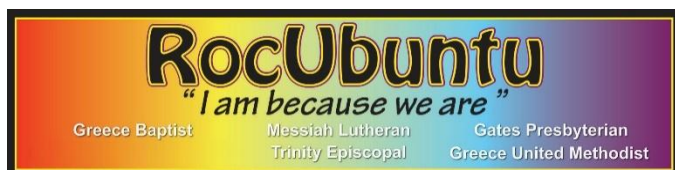
**August 4-8**

## RocUbuntu has three exciting projects planned for this summer!

**ONE: Collection for El Shaddai**, a congregation of mostly African refugee families that meets at Gates Presbyterian Church. We are collecting basic necessities for them on the Sundays in July: Dry beans- black and red, White rice, Peanut butter, Vegetable Oil, Cornmeal, White flour, Salt, Black tea bags, Tomato sauce, Canned tomatoes, Mandarin Oranges, Diapers, Hygiene Items. Place in designated box/bin in the narthex by the choir loft stairs. Please do not place with donations to our Food Pantry (which is in the narthex under the table between the double stairs.)

**TWO: Afghan fundraising dinner**, Saturday, July 26, 5-7pm at Greece Baptist Church, Door #4

### Dine-In and Drive-Thru

Menu: Chicken kabob, lamb, saffron rice, raisin and carrot rice, salad, Afghan bread, baklava, pistachio pudding, iced tea, water, lemonade.

Suggested donation is \$20-30 but any amount is greatly appreciated. Keeping our Promise will use the funds to settle Afghan refugees: first three months rent and utilities.

## COUNCIL NEWS

At our meeting on June 5th, Council reviewed our financials, which continue to do well. In May, the Food Pantry designated funds balance dropped by \$1,662 to \$19,016.

We heard from our representatives to Synod Assembly which was held on Zoom this year (as a cost savings measure). The experience lacked the opportunity to interact with others which made it tough to stay fully engaged. Fortunately, the next couple of Synod Assemblies will return to the in-person format of the past.

A major topic of conversation was the approval of updates to Messiah's Policy Document. Updates included listing our recognized holidays (Juneteenth was added), documenting our bereavement policy, guidelines for receiving memorial/tribute gifts, and tracking the receipt and spending of grant money. Pastor Aileen noted how few congregations in the

Synod have a document like this and how helpful it is.

We also reviewed changes proposed by the Mutual Ministry Team to the job descriptions for our staff. These were last updated in 2019, and many of the updates simply reflect how we have changed the way we do things over time and since the pandemic. Some additions were also made to clarify or improve documentation of employee benefits. The proposed updates were approved by Council.

As always, if you have any questions or concerns, feel free to bring those to any member of Council for our attention.

**Stephen Ministry -**  
**Receptivity to Receiving Care**

Many people are more open to giving care than to receiving it. When we are giving care, we feel stable and secure. When receiving care, we can feel like we're acknowledging weakness, insecurity, or vulnerability.

As a result, there are countless people today who, though they really could benefit from a fellow Christian who would listen and care for them, instead tough it out on their own. They remain the "strong silent type", or wear a smile across a face that is holding back tears.

But God did not create us to be independent - we were created to be interdependent. The New Testament includes more than 50 verses that contain the words "one another" - "love one another," "encourage one another," "build up one another," and "pray for one another." That means it's reciprocal; in addition to loving, encouraging, building up, and praying for others, we are to allow other people to do the same for us!

God does not intend for us to suffer alone. Jesus promises, "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest" (Matthew 11:28). We can receive this promised rest when we turn to one another for comfort and help.



That's why we have Stephen Ministers. Many of them have been on the receiving end of care in their lives. They know how difficult it is to ask for help, but they also know the great personal and spiritual growth and healing that follow. They know how to support in a loving, caring, and nonjudgmental manner. They are equipped, ready, and waiting to provide the comfort and care God very much desires you to have.

But hurting people may need help overcoming a barrier to accepting care. So if you find someone who is hurting and could benefit from having a Stephen Minister to walk with them, encourage them to give it a try, and seek their permission to pass their name along to Pastor Aileen. Or, if you find yourself facing a season of difficulties, be open to receiving God's love and grace through another person. Our Stephen Ministry offers the opportunity for a very confidential relationship with someone who will listen to and provide sorely needed care and encouragement. ## Messiah's Food Pantry

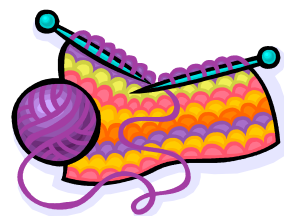
**Messiah's Food Pantry has been greatly affected by cuts to Federal Food Assistance Programs, making the need for donations from our congregation even greater. Our current needs are:** canned vegetables (corn, peas, green beans, carrots), canned fruit (mixed fruit, peaches, pears) dry pasta, and pasta sauce (no glass jars). For our kids packs: individual juice boxes/pouches. Place items in the bin in the narthex under the table between the stairs from the main entrance into the narthex. Gifts cards are always welcome (Aldi's are especially help-

## Meow Ministry

Meow Ministry works to reduce the suffering and population of the hundreds of abandoned or feral cats in our area.

Volunteers in the city are often finding dire circumstances affecting stray cats' health. Vital cat shelters get thrown out, as well as food and water. Many residents misunderstand the cats' situations, leading to efforts to get rid of them. An example is thinking the cats attract rats who eat the cat food. But these cats need all the food given to them, and each day keeping a close eye on them confirms this.

Our rescuers may use hundreds of pounds of food weekly. They also have to directly intervene with the cats, as most of them face health challenges requiring veterinary treatment and drugs. Plenty of cats need neutering through the TNV(R) program, and many are barely beyond their kittenhood, already pregnant. An overpopulation of unneutered animals is the result of carelessness, ignorance or financial household distress.

But you can help! Cans of wet food and bags of Kit 'n Kaboodle or Purina Cat or Kitten Chow are great choices to add to your shopping list. Also chicken baby food jars. Just place items in the Meow box to the right of the fellowship hall downstairs.

Any amount of food or financial help counts to us. We have been blessed by recent donations of both, which defrays costs of food, shelters, health care and neutering for our rescuers. Thank you so much! Make checks to Messiah with a memo to Meow Ministry. You can drop them in the weekly collection. Your contributions mean that lives are saved and suffering cats become happy cats. Thank you for thinking of us!

Policy Focus

Did you know that Messiah has both an Endowment Fund and a Memorial Fund to help support expenses which are not part of our general operating budget?

From the [Endowment Fund’s description and charter document](#): *In 2024 the congregation agreed to use a portion of the income from this fund’s investments to support members’ passions for ministry, establishing the Ministry Project Grants Program. These grants will provide funds for projects that minister to the members of our congregation, our community and our world. They may be used to finance special projects that fundraise for certain ministries, provide service activities for our community, or educate people about important issues. We welcome any ideas that support Messiah’s mission- Called into community, gifted to serve; Glorifying God through love in action. We seek to provide ways for people to grow their faith while serving God’s world.*

Excerpts from the [Messiah Policy document \(5.6.7.1\)](#): *Gift and Memorial Acceptance All permanent gifts and memorials to the church shall be approved by the Congregation Council. All such gifts shall be evaluated as to appropriateness, quality, theology (with the advice of a Pastor), and any additional costs which may occur with the acceptance of the gift...If a donor wishes to commission art or other items to be made for the church, detailed plans and a review of the artist or craftsman shall be presented to the Council for review prior to commencing.*

The Endowment Fund is primarily used to fund new and creative ministry ideas which support the mission and vision of the church; while the Memorial Fund is used to purchase

long-lasting items such as the technology used to stream online services, a wheelchair for member and visitor use, and significant decorating upgrades to the Sanctuary.

If you are interested in making a donation to either fund, indicate this on the memo line when you give to the church. If you are interested in applying for grant funding, please reach out to Ellen Meyer to determine if a Ministry Project Grant could be a good fit or Andy Mitchell to discuss other potential sources of funding. All members of Messiah may access Ministry Project Grant applications through Cathy in the church office.
